

MEZCAL

This traditional Mexican spirit is distilled using the hearts of several different agave species, the most common being Espadin. Primarily crafted in Oaxaca, it can also be produced in 8 other states of Mexico. Mezcal is traditionally double-distilled and referred to as the smoky cousin of tequila.
